- 2019-20 - Increase the percentage of students whose Lexile score is at or above grade level
- 2018-19 - Increase the percentage of students whose Lexile score is at or above grade level  
58.28% (CVMS), 50.58% (6th), 53.53% (7th),  
71.70% (8th)
- 2017-18 - Increase the percentage of students whose Lexile score is at or above grade level

- 72.8% of its 8th grade students** are **reading at or above the grade level target**.

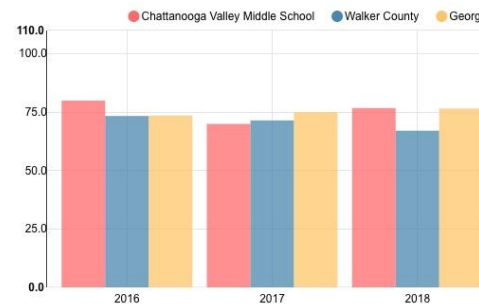

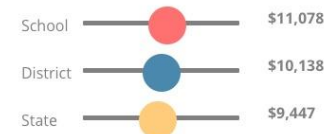
### School Climate Star Rating



### Financial Efficiency Star Rating




### Per Pupil Expenditures
