What is a Title I School?

- A school that receives federal funding to ensure all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education.
- Strong focus on parent and family engagement notification and involvement.

How does our school spend Title I money?

• Title I Funds	\$158,256
• Personnel	\$ 72,327
• Family Engagement	\$ 2,350
• Balance	\$ 83,579

- 67.61% of our students receive free or reduced lunches.
- Our funding is used to benefit all students instead of a few targeted students.

- ELA teachers keep a current Google Classroom with daily lessons, assignments, and links to additional resources


